### **Emergency Visa Services**

- 1. Government of India has suspended all existing visas issued to nationals of all countries (other than those issued to Diplomats, Officials, UN staff, Employment and Project visas) till 15<sup>th</sup> April, 2020. Visa free travel facility granted to Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) card holders has also been kept in abeyance till 15 April 2020. - 2. The online visa application process has been suspended. Emergency visas may be issued only if there are compelling reasons for travel. Foreign nationals (including OCI cardholders) seeking emergency visas for travel to India may apply using the manual visa form at <a href="https://www.hcipretoria.gov.in/docs/1584439885Manual%20Visa%20Form COVID.pdf">https://www.hcipretoria.gov.in/docs/1584439885Manual%20Visa%20Form COVID.pdf</a>.
